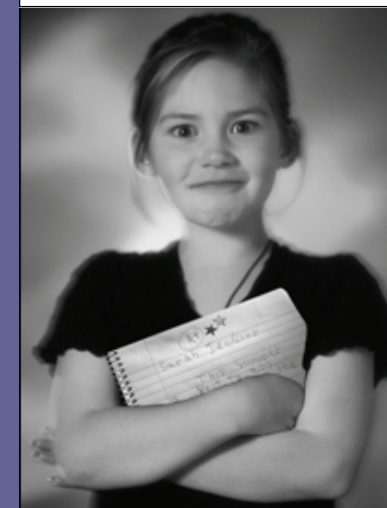

The Learning Disabilities Association of Central New York provides the following services:

Educational Consulting

- Current information about learning disabilities, ADD and related disorders
- Assists parents in accessing appropriate services for child's educational programming

SAIL - Summer Adventures In Learning

- Classes designed to enable students with learning difficulties ages 6 - 14, to succeed and maintain their skills during the summer months. The classes are offered in a small and relaxed environment, and taught by teachers trained in learning disabilities. Emphasis is on self-advocacy and individual learning styles.

Transition Program

- A hands on, individualized program that provides critical information, skills and tools for students with learning disabilities or attention deficit disorder, helping them to make a successful transition from high school to post secondary education and/or employment.

Adult Services

- Resources for adults with learning disabilities, ADD and related disorders
- Consultations concerning education, employment, housing and financial matters for adults with learning disabilities, ADD and related disorders

SOAR/Adult Recreation Group

- Support with life and social skills, and offers social opportunities

Pathways - Employment Program

- Job placement services to individuals that require short term assistance with job search and retention
- Services vary depending on the level of assistance that each individual requires

LIFE - An independent residential program for adults

- Support for individuals to live independently, including residential habilitation and social/recreation opportunities

Services Available to Employers

- Information and resources specifically pertaining to learning disabilities, ADD, and related disorders regarding employment issues, including assistance in developing employee accommodations, and assistance with the Americans with Disabilities Act

Conferences

- Annual conferences on a variety of topics relating to learning disabilities and ADD

Referral Services

- Information regarding tutors, psychologists and evaluations

Library & Audio-Visual Reference Center

- Books, reference materials, videos and DVDs are available to borrow or purchase
